FIGHTING FOR THE TREES



Deforestation, a rapidly growing problem, takes the homes from wildlife and affects entire ecosystems, weather patterns, air quality, and the climate. Forests are the habitat for 80 percent

of land animals; each year, we lose more trees, and more animal species go extinct.

Desiring to make a difference in their community, Lions in Korea adopted the environment cause area and are tackling this critical issue. In

one urban area, local citizens were in need of a more open space to enjoy the fresh mountain air. Then, local Lions planted a thousand trees with support of a District and Club Community Impact grant of more than US\$34,000 from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

Lions planted cypress and camellia trees, both fast-growing species that will quickly grow into a forest. Fresh oxygen, improved air quality, shade, and tranquility are just some benefits the trees will offer local residents.

The Lions Forest has added tremendous value to the community, members of which now go there to hike or simply enjoy nature.

China's Water Challenges

- 28,000+ rivers and waterways dried in last 25 years
- 70% of water table unfit for humans due to pesticides, fertilizers²



Climate Change in Korea

- World's 7th-largest greenhouse gas emitter
Annual greenhouse emissions reached record high in 2017
- Summer 10 days longer 2009-2018 than 1981-2010³
