

My Lions Youth Exchange Journey: 1998-1999

- Article in Milton Ulladulla Times about hosting youth from overseas
- My family
- Ulladulla-Milton Lions Club host youth from around the world in July – August
- Joined Lions November 1999





December 1998

 Youth from Japan and Malaysia hosted by Ulladulla Milton Lions Club

2000-2002

- Youth choose whether they wanted to attend a camp
- 6 week exchange
- Life experiences for youth very different
- Relying on photos to record experiences



Perceptions About Australia

- Australia is a small country so it is easy to visit places such as Ulura and the Great Barrier Reef
- Sydney is the capital of Australia
- Kangaroos are found everywhere
- Dangerous creatures (spiders etc) are found everywhere















Australia Size Comparison









2014

- Rejoined Lions and became a charter member of Urunga Lions Club
- Lions Youth Exchange Program was adopted as a club project
- Chose to host 2 youth at a time as I no longer had children at home



Youth I Have Hosted: 2014-2019

- Each year I hosted youth for periods of 1-3 weeks
 - July: Europe (usually the Netherlands)
 - August: Japan
 - December January: Malaysia, New Zealand, Japan
- 30 youth hosted



Youth I Have Hosted: 2014-2019 continued

- Facebook became the key way to record my experiences with the youth I hosted
- Family and friends were able to share the Youth Exchange journey with the youth I hosted as it was happening
- A permanent record of exchange that is easily accessible






