PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Carlos Bugmann S., of Temuco, Chile, served a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs after his election at the association's 66th annual convention held in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA, June 22-25, 1983.

Past Director Bugmann is a businessman in agriculture, industry and transportation and is primarily involved in his own transport company.
