PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Alex Grieve, of Timaru, South Canterbury, New Zealand, served a two-year term as an international director of The International Association of Lions Clubs after his election at the association's 57th annual convention held in San Francisco, California, USA, July 1974.

Past Director Grieve is the retired Harbor Master of Timaru.

A Lion since 1962, he is a life member of the Timaru Suburban Lions Club. He has held many offices, including club president, district governor, zone chairman and council chairman.
