

MIN-KOO KANG
INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Min-Koo Kang, of Seoul, South Seoul, Republic of Korea, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 72nd annual convention, held in Miami/Miami Beach, Florida, USA, June 21-24, 1989.

Director Kang is president of a development company specializing in hotels and country clubs. He has also been a past president of several other corporations.

A Lion and charter member of the Seoul South Seoul Lions Club since 1959, Director Kang has served as club president, zone chairman, district governor and council chairman. He also served as chairman of an OSEAL Forum.
