PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Roger R. Richert, of Bellevue, Washington, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 74th International Convention, held in Brisbane, Queensland, Australia, June 18-21, 1991.

Past Director Richert is an architect.

A member of the Renton Lions Club since 1964, Past Director Richert has held many offices within the association, including club president, district governor and council chair. His numerous responsibilities on the multiple district level have included White Cane Day chairperson, Leadership chairperson and Membership and Extension chairperson. He is also a past president of the Washington-Northern Idaho Lions Sight Conservation Foundation for a two-year term.

Past Director Richert has presented and moderated at three international conventions and six USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forums. He served as a group leader at four District Governor-elect Seminars and as the Pacific West regional coordinator for the North American Membership Growth Program (NAMGP) for three years. He has served as a faculty member for the North American Leadership Institute on five occasions and as a faculty member for the USA MERL team training. He also served as the Multiple District 19 membership chairperson, Multiple District 19 Impact Team trainer, and on the faculty for North America MERL training. Recently he served six years as the Multiple District 19 membership chairperson as part of the Multiple District 19 LEM/PR Leadership Team. Currently, he is the Multiple District 19 LCIF coordinator for Washington and northern Idaho.

In recognition of his many contributions to the association, Past Director Richert has received numerous District Governor Appreciation Awards, the Multiple District Distinguished Service Award, three International President's Certificates of Appreciation, the Brian Stevenson Fellowship, eight International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor granted to a member by the association. He is also a Life Member of the Renton Lions Club and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

Past Director Richert is active in several civic and professional organizations, including the American Institute of Architects and the Council of Educational Facility Planners.
