PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Robert L. Way, of Chehalis, Washington, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as an international director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 61st International Convention, held in Tokyo, Japan, June 21-24 1978.

Past Director Way is a veteran of the Korean War and is a retired executive of the General Electric Company.

Past Director Way has been a Lions club member since 1959. He served as club president in 1962-63 and as a 100 % District Governor in 1968-69. He has served on many major committees at the district, multiple district and international levels and for four years he served as a member of the USA/Canada Forum Committee. He is the recipient of five International President's Awards, as well as the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor bestowed upon a member by the association. He is also a Melvin Jones Fellow.

In 1980, the General Electric Company selected Past Director Way as one of five General Electric Company employees in the world to receive the Gerald L. Philippe Award for distinguished public service.

Past Director Way has served as a member of the board of directors of the Central New York Eye Bank, Empire State Speech and Hearing Clinic, Lighthouse of Onondaga County, Central New York Association of the Hearing-Impaired and Camillus Historical Museum.
