

HENRY D. WOFFORD
PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Henry D. Wofford, of Johnston, South Carolina, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 60th International Convention, held in New Orleans, Louisiana, USA, June 1977.

Past Director Wofford is the owner and operator of Wofford's, a men's retail clothing store.

A Lion with 58 years of perfect attendance, Past Director Wofford has served as a 100% District Governor and chairman of his state's Council of Governors. He was chairman for the South Carolina Lions Major Activities Committee and has held most club offices, including president.

In recognition of his service efforts for the association, Past Director Wofford has been honored with the Gold Star Award, International President's Awards, numerous Extension Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor granted to a member of the association. He is a Melvin Jones Fellow.

Elected "Outstanding Young Man of South Carolina" in 1954, Lion Wofford was a member of the District Advisory Council for the South Carolina Small Business Administration. He has served as a trustee of the South Carolina Baptist Foundation and past president of the Johnston Merchant's Association.

Active in community-oriented projects, Past Director Wofford is a former trustee of the Connie Maxwell Children's Home, former secretary of the Johnston Medical Center, former vice-chairman of the South Carolina District Boy Scouts of America and vice president of the South Carolina Eye Bank, Inc.
