Lions Emergency/Non-Emergency Assistance

After the 2001 attack on the World Trade Center, Lions in New York and elsewhere mobilized their resources and provided emergency assistance. Lions did the same after the 2004 tsunami in South East Asia, the 2005 earthquake in Pakistan, and Hurricane Katrina (2005) in the US.

Now, every Lions club has been challenged to help develop a **LIONS ALERT** emergency response plan for their community. The Lions Web site features the easy-to-follow Lions ALERT guide (IAD 911).

The **Lions Emergency/Non-Emergency Assistance** database provides an online location for Lions and non-Lions to request and offer emergency and non-emergency humanitarian assistance (both human services and material resources) for any Lions project.
