FOR OUTSTANDING YOUTH

Lions can reward the volunteer and leadership efforts of youth with two newly created youth awards.

Lions Young Leaders in Service Awards

These club-level awards honor young people ages 12-18 who have completed 50 or 100 hours of community service.

Lions clubs provide the award criteria to schools, Leo clubs, and community youth organizations. Then, eligible applicants record their hours of volunteer service. Clubs present Silver Seal Certificates to young people who have performed 50 hours of service and Gold Seal Certificates to those who have performed 100 hours of service.

Young Ambassadors of the 21st Century Award

This award provides districts and multiple districts with a means of recognizing young people ages 15-19 who excel in community service, leadership, public speaking, and academics.

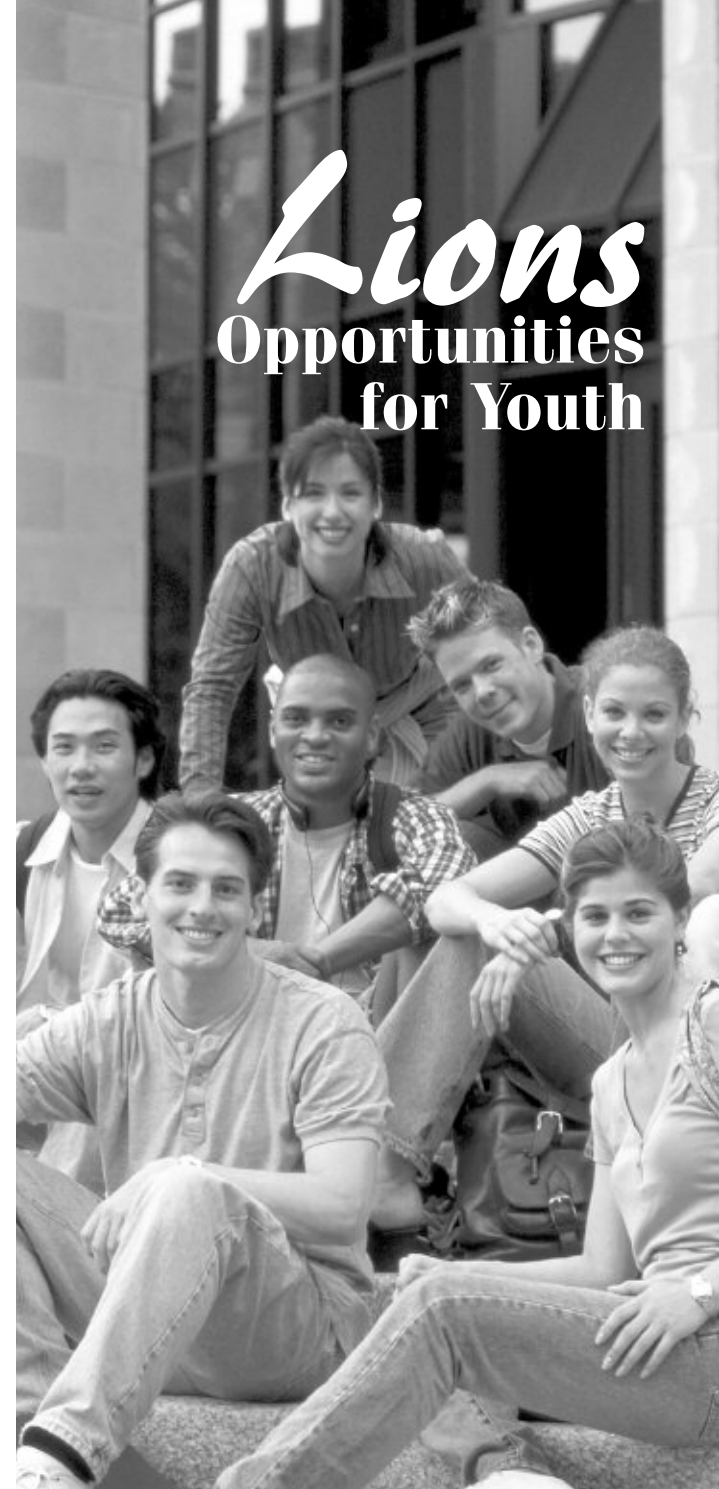

AN ACTIVITY GUIDE FOR LIONS CLUBS

The mission of Lions Opportunities for Youth is:

To provide the young people of the world with opportunities for achievement, learning, contribution and service, individually and collectively, through sponsorship of activities identified as best practices in the field of youth development.

Encouraging, guiding, and mentoring youth are investments in the future.

Opportunities for Lions to light the path for youth range from implementing joint Lions/youth service projects to rewarding service-minded youth. Lions are community leaders who are experienced in organizing service projects. By working with schools and youth groups, Lions can share their time and talents with youth.

This activity guide provides a variety of youth service project suggestions. With guidance from Lions, these projects can be planned and implemented by youth.

Youth project suggestions

AID FOR THE ELDERLY

- Visit the elderly in their homes or in nursing facilities.
- Perform simple home repairs and household chores for the elderly.
- Complete errands for the elderly or transport them to medical appointments, banking facilities, religious services, etc.
- Organize a formal dinner and dance for the elderly in a community center or retirement facility.

CHILDREN

- Collect clothing, toys, or school supplies for needy children.
- Read stories to young children or tutor for school-age students.
- Visit the pediatrics ward of a local hospital.

ENVIRONMENT

- Plant trees.
- Clean-up a roadway, park, shoreline, or playground.
- Organize a recycling campaign.
- Paint a colorful mural over graffiti.

HELP THE HOMELESS/HUNGRY

- Collect food, clothing, and personal hygiene items for donation to a local shelter.
- Participate in a Habitat for Humanity house-building project.
- Create food baskets for needy families.

LITERACY

- Help a child – or an adult – learn to read and write.
- Organize a used book sale. Donate the proceeds to a local literacy project.
- Read books for the visually impaired. Or, record “talking books” on audiotapes.

PUBLIC HEALTH

- Assist with a vision, hearing, or diabetes detection screening.
- Collect used eyeglasses and hearing aids for recycling.
- Create awareness of AIDS, teen suicide, and substance abuse.
- Help raise funds for health issues such as juvenile diabetes.

SAFETY AND SPECIAL RECREATION

- Organize a seminar on topics such as: water safety, fire prevention, traffic awareness, vehicle seat belt use, bicycle safety, etc.
- Participate in the Lions Global Opening Eyes vision screening program in cooperation with Special Olympics.

Encourage participation in Global Youth Service Day

Work with youth to organize a youth forum, community improvement project, or celebration event for Global Youth Service Day.

This annual event, celebrated on the third Saturday in April, recognizes the year-round contributions of young people serving their communities.
