

TREVOR PRESCOTT BARON
PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Trevor P. Baron of Hamilton, New Zealand, served a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs following his election at the association's 49th International Convention, held in New York, New York, USA, July 6-9, 1966.

Lion Baron was the charter secretary of his home club where he earned the 100% Secretary Award. He was elected club president and was awarded the 100% President's Award. Later as deputy district governor, he received the Deputy District Governor's Membership Award. While serving as district governor, he received the 100% District Governor Award and chartered 12 clubs. Past Director Baron holds 33 years of perfect attendance, has received eight International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor bestowed upon a member by the association. He is a Life Member of his club, a Key Member and a Melvin Jones Fellow.

He had the honor of chartering the first Lions club in the Fiji Islands and chaired the committee for the formation of the Nandi club.

In addition to his Lion activities, Past Director Baron has a continuing interest in helping children and is a life member of the Intellectually Handicapped Children's Association and has served as auditor for the Save the Children Fund. He is also a member of the Heritage, Birthwright and Waikato Cancer Association.
