

MASANORI FUKUI
PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Masanori Fukui, of Kyoto, Japan, served a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs following his election at the association's 78th International Convention, held in Seoul, Republic of Korea, July 4-7, 1995.

Past Director Fukui is the president of three companies.

A member of the Yamashiro Lions Club since 1965, Past Director Fukui has held many positions within the association, including club president, deputy district governor, district governor, council chairman and assistant coordinator for the multiple district council chairmen of Japan. He was also a member of several district committees.
