PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Freddie A. Joyce, of Searcy, Arkansas, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 71st annual convention, held in Denver, Colorado, USA, June 29 - July 2, 1988.
