

**SCOTT A. RENNELS**  
**PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR**

Scott Rennels, of Jonesboro, Arkansas, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 82nd International Convention, held in San Diego, California, USA, June 28 - July 2, 1999.

Past Director Rennels is president of Shelby Skipwith Inc. representing York International and is executive vice president and chief operating officer of Four Seasons HVAC Dist. Inc.

A member of the Jonesboro Nettleton Lions Club since 1987, Past Director Rennels has held many offices within the association, including club president, zone chairman, district governor and council chairman. He has served as a presenter, moderator and discussion leader at previous USA/Canada Forums and was a member and later chairman of the Leadership Committee. He also served on the Executive Committee for the USA/Canada Forum 2000 and is a member of the USA/Canada Forum Planning Committee for 2002. At the 85th International Convention, held in Osaka, Japan, July 8-12, 2002, Past Director Rennels was appointed to serve on the Long Range Planning and Public Relations committees by the International Board of Directors. In addition, he is past president of the Lions World Services for the Blind and an honorary member of the Hot Springs Village Evening Lions Club.

In recognition of his service to the association, Past Director Rennels has received numerous awards, including two Lion of the Year Awards, a Guiding Lion Award, an Extension Award, three International President's Medals, several International President's Certificates of Appreciation and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lion activities, Past Director Rennels is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He is a member of the Jonesboro Leadership Alumni Association and serves on the board of directors for the Southridge Fire Department. He also served as state president of the Arkansas Society of the Sons of the American Revolution and as an alternate trustee for the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. Past Director Rennels is a former North Vietnamese interpreter and translator. He is president of Dyeann's House Inc. He and his wife Deborah are co-founders of the southern Illinois chapter of the Dream Factory, an organization that grants dreams to seriously and terminally ill children.
