Founded in 1922, Rehabilitation International (RI) is an international NGO dedicated to advancing the rights and inclusion of people with disabilities, with member organizations covering more than 100 countries and regions. Zhang Haidi, Chair of China Disabled Persons' Federation (CDPF) , was first elected as President of RI in 2014 for the term 2016–2020 in 2014 and re-elected in 2018 for the term 2020–2024.

On September 27, 2019, the Award Committee of Rehabilitation International (RI) Award for Outstanding Achievements convened in Beijing and announced the Award winners. The three laureates from Ecuador, Ethiopia and Sri Lanka have been dedicated to helping persons with disabilities, carrying forward the humanitarianism and great love.
