

## 2.2 billion people+ globally live with visual impairment<sup>1</sup>

#### **DELIVERING THE GIFT OF SIGHT**



Visual impairment. It's a major health issue for an aging global population, including those aged 50+ in rural Northern Greece. With grant funding from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), Lions have literally mobilized to

deliver the gift of eye care to seniors in remote villages, where access to diagnosis and treatment is challenging.

To achieve objective one – assessing residents' eye health – Lions allocated US\$125,000 in LCIF funding toward a van equipped with high-tech vision screening instruments. Trained on their use and joined by ophthalmic technicians

and eye specialists from local hospitals, Lions began journeying north to change lives.

"LCIF is making it possible for us to deliver screenings to 7,500 people in 50 locations," said Lion Tania Bekrodimitri. "Our van travels to the need. Each patient undergoes a basic exam, and those with a history of diabetes, or signs of glaucoma or macular degeneration, receive additional testing."

Vision screenings are just one aspect of the two-year project. Additional LCIF grant funding supports specialized training for local ophthalmologists, and patient education on eye disease and on avoiding visual impairment progression.

Ranking among countries with highest incidence of visual impairment

Nearly **7%** of Norwegians aged 50+ have moderate to severe vision impairment<sup>3</sup>

Diabetic retinopathy affects 43% of type 2 diabetes patients in the United Kingdom<sup>4</sup>
