

Why rebuild a small club?

- Expand service footprint
- Improve member growth at all organization levels
- Maintain name recognition in local community
- Preserve club history

Global Membership Approach (GMA): A process that works

- ► Build a Team
- **▶** Build a Vision (S.W.O.T. Analysis)
- ► Build a Plan (Goal Setting)
- Build Success



The Story of Italy Lions Club

- Once upon a time...as the story goes, we found the magic to rebuild the club
- The club was down to three members
- The club had one tenacious president who refused to let the club die





Process of Building a Team



Do your homework on who should be on your team

Include current district leadership and past district governors

- Have a brainstorming session with team
- Meet with club and leadership

Process of Building a Vision



- First, a meeting with club leadership is key
- Make a preliminary assessment of the current conditions of the club to help determine what is needed and resources available (S.W.O.T. Analysis)
- Discuss known community contacts and relationships
- Community needs assessment for service projects

Process of Building a Plan



- Importance of customizing a plan of action that fits the current club situation and S.W.O.T. Analysis keep it simple!
- Discuss doable options for immediate service and visibility in the community; create a plan of action
- Examine calendar of events in the community for service and visibility opportunities
- Determine where additional manpower will come from to do service; offer district help from other lions

Process of Building Success



- Members of the team assigned to the club must stay in touch with club leadership to encourage, support, and offer help – keep the communication channels open
- Members of the team need to work in the club's initial service projects and meet with them at club meetings
- Communicate and have recognized at district meetings the members of the club and what they have accomplished

Results of Rebuilding Process: After 5 months



- Revived Italy Lions Club; once again active & having meetings
- Increased their membership by eight members
- Reconnected the club with Italy and surrounding communities
- Completed two service projects and a fundraiser
- Made a visible statement to the community: The Lions are back!
